You can also choose to include the excursion to Tallinn, Estonia.





Higher Education in Finland

The Finnish education system is quick to adapt to innovative studying methods and techniques. For example, problem-based learning has been in use in Finnish education institutions for many years. Teaching methods in Finland feature student centered teaching methods. The key learning ethos are interaction, collaboration, and exploration. A learning system characterised by a continuum of discussion, cooperation, and research forms a knowledge creation process that is distinctively Finnish.

Finnish higher educational institutions are notably autonomous but largely funded by the Ministry of Education and Culture. Therefore, the Ministry also oversees the quality of teaching carefully.

The institutions are small enough to operate functionally and effectively. They are all internationally oriented with special regional features, and one can choose from a variety of learning environments ranging from larger urban campuses to ones that are close to nature.
