



How to apply for Master's Degrees taught in English

First joint application to higher education, spring 2026

Apply 7-21 January 2026 by 3.00 p.m.!

- Application for degree programmes offered in English.
- You can access the application form during the application period on Studyinfo.fi.
- You can apply for up to six degree programmes using the same application form.
- In the first joint application of the spring, it is not necessary to place the degree programmes in order of preference on the application form.
- You can make changes to your application during the application period by using the link in the confirmation email.
- You can be accepted up to six different degree programmes, but you can confirm only one study place in education that begins in the same academic term.
- Application fee of 100 euros:
 - ✓ The application fee is collected for **applicants from countries outside EU/EEA** seeking education leading to a degree in higher education.
 - ✓ There is no application fee for Finnish or EU citizens or those who are exempted from paying tuition fee.
 - ✓ The Finnish National Agency of Education will collect the application fee in connection with filling in the Studyinfo application form.

Entry requirements for Master's degrees

- The minimum eligibility criteria for the Master's degrees are:
 - ✓ a relevant Bachelor's degree (or other equivalent degree) and
 - ✓ at least two years of relevant work experience gained after the Bachelor's degree.
- The relevant fields of Bachelor's degree and work experience are degree programme-specific and detailed in specific eligibility criteria.
- Example: You have completed a bachelor's degree in engineering. Your degree is relevant for our master's degrees in engineering.
- There are no requirements for the academic success of the Bachelor's degree.
- English language proficiency certificate (only in MBA International Business Management programme). See accepted tests and exceptions from degree programme-specific admission criteria.

Entry requirements for Master's degrees

Work experience

- The required work experience is degree programme-specific. See detailed requirements from degree programme-specific admission criteria.
- Example: You are applying for master's degrees in engineering. Your work experience must be from the field of technology.
- The work experience must be gained after the bachelor's degree.
- The work experience must be demonstrated with work certificates.
- Applicant can count in work experience in joint application of spring 2026 until 31 July 2026.

Entrance exams for Master's degrees

- Student selection for Jamk's Master's degrees is based on entrance exams (and possible pre-assignments), or interviews.
- The entrance exams are conducted online.
- Check the specific admission criteria and information on entrance exams for each study programme you wish to apply for.
- All eligible applicants are invited to entrance exams.
- Invitations to the entrance exams are sent in the beginning of March by email.
- Entrance exams are arranged during March-April.
- The applicant must successfully strongly identify themselves as a part of the student selection process.

Tuition fees and scholarship

- The tuition fee for Jamk's Master's Degree programmes is 12 000 € per academic year.
- There are no tuition fees for Finnish or other EU/EEA-citizens.
- Certain types of residence permits exempts from paying the tuition fee.
- The tuition fees are for Master's degrees taught in English.
- A scholarship for tuition fee paying Master's Degree students can be granted if the student graduates in the degree programme's recommended period of study. The scholarship is 4000 €.
- The recommended period of study is
 - ✓ 2 years for 60 ECTS credits degree programmes
 - √ 3 years for 90 ECTS credits degree programmes
- The final deadline for paying the tuition fee is on **9 July 2026** for application period of spring 2026.





Application timetable in spring 2026

- Apply online on <u>studyinfo.fi</u> on 7 21 January 2026 by 3.00 p.m. Finnish time
- The required attachments must be submitted to the online application by 28
 January 2026 by 3.00 p.m. Finnish time at the latest
- Entrance exams are arranged in March-April
- Results are announced in the middle of April at the earliest and by 27 May 2026 at the latest
- The final deadline for accepting the study place, enrolling as attending or non-attending student and paying the possible tuition fee is **9 July 2026 by 3.00 p.m.** Finnish time, studyinfo.fi
- Admissions from waiting list end on 4 August 2026 at 3.00 p.m. Finnish time
- Studies will begin in autumn 2026



Open University Route Studies, Master's level

- Jamk's Open University Route application is for applicants who have completed Open Studies in a Finnish University or UAS and want to apply as a degree student.
- Eligibility requirements for Open University Route application:
 - relevant Bachelor's degree and
 - at least 24 months of relevant work experience and
 - 20 or 30 ECTS credits of suitable Master's degree studies in Open University or Open UAS
- You can start Open Studies even without fulfilling the work experience requirement yet.
- The work experience needs to be completed when you apply for a degree later.
- No entrance examination is needed.
- All eligible applicants (suitable degree, work experience, required open studies) who apply through Master's Level Open University Route are accepted to degree studies at Jamk.
- Applications in **May** and in **November**, studyinfo.fi.
- time period of two years after graduation.



Open UAS Studies

- Courses that belong to Bachelor's or Master's degree programmes – these studies can be credited later towards a degree.
- You can study route-studies (open route studies), competence modules, specialist trainings and individual course units.
- Offered as on-campus (contact teaching), blended (hybrid) or fully online learning.
- New courses start throughout the year.
- Some studies are offered free of charge.

Professional Teacher Education

- 60 ECTS credits, places of study: 24
- no tuition fees
- the pedagogical qualification for teaching your specific subject in Finland -> the background degree (tertiary level degree) defines what and where you are eligible to teach

Eligibility criteria for Professional Teacher Education

In most cases

- a relevant tertiary level degree from a University of Applied Sciences or a University and
- a minimum of three years' work experience corresponding to the content of the degree
- → a tertiary level degree must be completed, and the work experience must be acquired by the end of the application period



Eligibility criteria for Professional Teacher Education

- as an exception, e.g. the field of **Social services and health**
- **the degree** required for eligibility is either a **Bachelor's degree** completed at a University of Applied Sciences or a Master's degree completed either at a University of Applied Sciences or at a University
- work experience:
- **Bachelor's degree**: a minimum of **five years'** work experience corresponding to the content of the degree
- Master's degree: a minimum of three years' work experience corresponding to the content of the degree



Eligibility criteria for Professional Teacher Education

 if the tertiary level degree has been completed outside Finland, the decision on the recognition of the level of the degree by the Finnish National Agency for Education (EDUFI) is needed before applying

- 5. Submit application 7–21 January 3:00 p.m. UTC+2 on Studyinfo.fi
 - You can submit attachments until 28 January 3.00 p.m. UTC+2
 - Upload scanned copies; no paper documents required at this stage

Reform of JYU's doctoral education is underway

- JYU currently offers 18 doctoral programmes.
- In 2026, there will be six doctoral programmes.
- Although there will be fewer programmes available, it is still possible to complete doctoral studies in the same research fields as before.
- Information on the new programmes will be published on the JYU website in January–February 2026.
 - For now, our website still contains information on the current programmes, which are no longer accepting new doctoral students.

All doctoral programmes can be completed in English.

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Doctoral degree

- To be awarded a doctorate, the student admitted to doctoral training must
 - complete the required postgraduate studies;
 - demonstrate independent and critical thinking in the field of research; and
 - write a doctoral dissertation and defend it in public.
- The volume of doctoral studies varies between 30 and 50 ECTS credits, depending on the doctoral programme.
- Dissertation research is designed to be completed within 3-4 years of full-time work.

Dissertation requirements

- A dissertation is a comprehensive, research-based scientific presentation in the doctoral candidate's field of study. It represents the candidate's ability to independently and critically apply the methods of scientific research and create new scientific knowledge.
- A dissertation must meet the following scientific criteria and requirements for learning and competence. A dissertation must:
 - include new scientific knowledge and substantiated results as well as be scientifically convincing;
 - demonstrate the candidate's critical thinking, profound knowledge of the research field, command of scientific research methods and ability to apply them as well as
 - be scientifically honest and follow the norms of research integrity.
- A dissertation can take the form of an article-based dissertation or a monograph.
 - An article-based dissertation consists of articles which discuss the same set of problems and a summarising report of the articles written by the doctoral candidate.
 - A monograph dissertation is a previously unpublished, comprehensive dissertation based on scientific research work in the author's name.
- There are two stages to the examination of a dissertation: a preliminary examination and a public examination. During the latter, the doctoral candidate must defend their dissertation in public.

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Doctoral studies

- There are no tuition fees for doctoral studies.
- There are many ways to earn study credits, e.g., courses, seminars, book exams, conference presentations, research visits, and teaching related to the field of research.
- The doctoral programmes are not designed for distance or online learning. All doctoral students are expected to be able to be present on campus at least occasionally.
- Admission to a doctoral programme does not include funding. Funding must be applied separately.
- Funding options:
 - Doctoral Researcher position (salary, employment relationship)
 - Grant research (scholarship, no employment relationship)
 - Part-time doctoral studies (no funding for full-time doctoral studies)



Eligibility requirements

Master's degree

- a relevant master's degree awarded by a university
- a relevant master's degree awarded by a university of applied sciences
- a relevant study programme abroad which in the awarding country gives eligibility for doctoral training

Master's thesis

- At least a grade of Good (3/5) or another grade of a similar level for the master's thesis, if the thesis has been evaluated
- Language proficiency requirements
 - Proficiency in Finnish or in English demonstrated in one of the ways specified in the admission guidelines
 - Language proficiency can be demonstrated by a Master's degree awarded by a Finnish university of applied sciences.



How to apply

Application guidelines

Application guidelines will be updated before the next application round in April 2026!

- Two application rounds per year in April and in September
- No application fee
- Application form in the Studyinfo.fi portal
- Online application form and required attachments
 - Research plan and doctoral study plan
 - Degree certificate and transcript of records
 - A certificate of language proficiency (not required if you have a master's degree awarded by JAMK)
 - Some programmes require a CV, a motivation letter and a recommendation from a supervisor.
- Applicants must arrange supervision for their doctoral dissertation before applying!







Main stages in applying

- 1. Get to know the doctoral programmes
- 2. Check your eligibility
- 3. Think about a possible research topic and consider different funding options
- 4. Find out the availability of relevant supervision
- 5. Find out about the assessment procedure
- 6. Submit your application
