

Exporting References from Our Databases into RefWorks

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A. Direct Export to RefWorks

1. Perform search.	Select the references and perform direct export to RefWorks.	
Janet	Clicking on the title which you want to export. Click Export reference-> Export to Refworks.	You will need to edit thesis references manually in RefWorks. Mark the reference, click Edit , and add: Publisher: [Field], [Degree Programme] Place of Publication: Bachelor's/Master's Thesis. JAMK University of Applied Sciences.
Melinda, Arto	Mark the references and click View selected . In the bottom of the page, select: Reference Management . > Select: Selected and RefWorks export . > Click Submit .	Theses, see above.
Books24x7	Click Citation below the book's title. >Select the output style (Chicago, MLA, or APA) and click Export to RefWorks .	Does not work on IE 10. Mozilla Firefox: You can bypass the browser's security warnings.
Ebrary	Click the RefWorks button below the document on the search results page.	
EBSCOhost: Academic Search Elite Business Source Elite, Cinahl, ERIC Hospitality & Tourism	The single title side click Export > select Direct Export to RefWorks > Save OR collect the references with Folder+ -icon >Click the yellow Folder on the toolbar and select the references. > Click the Export icon. > Select: Direct Export to RefWorks and click Save .	
Emerald	Mark the references > For selected items -menu : Select Download citation(s) >Select Refworks > Click Download article citation data	You can build your own marked lists if you create your own profile to Emerald. To do this, click My Profile and fill in your details to complete the registration process.
IEEE Xplore	Select the references and click Download Citations on top of the search results list. > Select RefWorks and click Download Citation .	If you have RefWorks open already and export from IEEE Xplore, a new browser window will open up with these new titles in RefWorks. Close down your original RefWorks window to keep track of your references.

Medic	Select the reference and click the red RefWorks icon on the right.	Exporting several references at a time, see B.
ProQuest ABI/Inform, IIMPFT	Mark the references and click Save above the search results. > Select RefWorks and click Continue (when working off campus, make sure the Deselect items when done box is unchecked).	You can set up a My Research account in any ProQuest database and link it to your RefWorks account. Anything you save to your research account will be saved to RefWorks as well. For instructions, click Learn more in the Export view. If direct export does not work, see instructions in part C.
Sage Journals	Mark the references and click Add citations . > Click Save/Print/Email/Download > Select Format: Citation Only OR Citation + Abstract > Click Download To Citation Manager and click RefWorks on the right-hand side of the screen.	If direct export does not work, see part B.
ScienceDirect (Elsevier)	Mark the references and click Export citations . > Select: Citations Only or Citations and Abstracts and Save to RefWorks .	

B. Importing a reference to RefWorks as text

1. Perform search.	2. Save the references in text format and copy.	3. Go to RefWorks and select: References / + > Select : Import.
Cochrane Library	Mark the references and click Export Selected Citations . > Select Export Type: Abstract and Citation and File Type: PC or Macintosh or Unix or Linux . > Click Export Citation and Save File . > Open the file and copy the text to the clipboard.	1. Import Filter /Data Source: JAMK University of Applied Sciences. 2. Database: Cochrane Library. 3. Click From Text and paste the text in the box. 4. Click Import .

C. Importing a reference to RefWorks as a RIS file

1. Perform search.	2. Save the references as a RIS file.	3. Go to RefWorks and select: References > Import.
