



Coordination of the Transitional Labour Markets in Central Finland –project

The Transitional Labour Market (TLM) theory is a useful approach to analyze the combinations of flexibility and security, as it is not only a national model concerning one country, but a comprehensive conceptual system emphasizing labour market transitions during the life course (Räisänen & Schmid, 2008).

Who are we?

The City of Jyväskylä and the JAMK University of Applied Sciences are located in the heart of Central Finland. JAMK carries out applied research and development as a regional developer for the purposes of trade & industry and the public sector. National Institute for Health and Welfare has strong competence for evaluation issues.

What we are doing?

We have been clarifying the collaboration between different TLM-actors in the municipalities and regions in the Central Finland area. Now the aim of the TLM-project is to support our TLM-network in their development work to achieve their goals.

Expertise

There are a lot of reforms going on in the field of social employment. We are analyzing the new ideas and discussing these ideas at various working groups and meetings.

Networking

In Central Finland there are approximately 80 projects run by NGOs which develop TLM. We work together with NGOs and authorities (e.g. Social and Healthcare, Education and Employment) in order to clarify roles and tasks for each actor. In TLM-network meetings we discuss uprising problems and find solutions within the network.

TLM-Education

TLM-network is mainly run by NGO's temporary project (exterior money) and measures are funded by Employment Officials. We are building up the knowledge of NGOs to recognize their own know-how concerning the social employment. We are encouraging them to redesign their services and make longer contracts with municipalities and Employment Officials.
