





INCENTIVE PROGRAMS AND RESOURCES

Michigan has established several state and local economic development resources that provide support for companies investing and expanding their operations and workforces in Michigan communities. Some of these include:

MICHIGAN BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM (MBDP)

The Michigan Business Development Program is available from the Michigan Strategic Fund (MSF), in cooperation with MEDC. The program is designed to provide grants, loans or other economic assistance to businesses for highly competitive projects in Michigan that create jobs and/or provide investment.

JOBS READY MICHIGAN

The Jobs Ready Michigan program was created by the Michigan Strategic Fund to meet the talent needs of companies that are expanding or relocating to Michigan. The program is designed to be flexible and responsive to the specific talent needs of companies and to address the costs associated with recruiting and training individuals for occupations that are high-wage, high-skill, or high-demand.

Program awards may be used for a variety of activities related to talent recruitment and job training including, but not limited to, employee recruitment expenses, development of customized training development plans, instructor and training materials costs, purchase of equipment related to training, construction of training facilities, and on-the job training costs.

STATE ESSENTIAL SERVICES ASSESSMENT (SESA) EXEMPTION AND ALTERNATIVE STATE ESSENTIAL SERVICES INCENTIVE PROGRAMS

The State Essential Services Assessment is required for manufacturers that do not pay personal property tax on eligible manufacturing personal property. The MSF, in certain circumstances, may choose to exempt or reduce the Assessment for projects that create jobs and/or private investment in Michigan through the State Essential Services Assessment (SESA) Exemption or the Alternative State Essential Services Assessment Incentive.

MICHIGAN COMMUNITY REVITALIZATION PROGRAM (MCRP)

MCRP is a program available from the MSF, in cooperation with MEDC, designed to promote community revitalization that will accelerate private investment in areas of historical disinvestment, contribute to Michigan's reinvention as a vital, job-generating state, foster redevelopment of functionally obsolete or historic properties, reduce blight; and protect the natural resources of the state.

Innovation - Advanced Materials Accelerating development and commercialization.


The Carbon Technology Center has been established to develop fundamental and applied carbon materials technology. Consistent with the strengths of Michigan Tech, emphasis is placed on materials characterization and end use applications. This partnership between industry and academia has resulted in a world-class carbon research center.

Michigan Tech University is the designated research and commercialization center for Advanced Materials in the State of Michigan, through the Michigan Translational Research & Commercialization (MTRAC) program. MTRAC supports collaborative translational research projects led by teams of researchers, and business advisors as needed, working in the area of advanced applied materials. The mission of this program is to advance materials-based technologies into commercial development that address poorly met market needs across many sectors such as life sciences, aerospace, automotive, construction.



Keweenaw Peninsula is on the Move.

The Keweenaw Peninsula is on the move. Local manufacturing companies have undertaken significant expansions in the past five years; a large number of new homegrown businesses have started up, including the spin-off of new technologies from MTU; several international technology companies have recently entered into the area from Finland, Sweden, Poland and China; a burgeoning cluster of advanced materials and manufacturing growth companies has emerged-- some of these companies are manufacturing and shipping products around the world; Green forces is a collaboration and cluster of proven companies who provide total high-tech solutions to the defense and aerospace industries. Green Forces companies specialize in system engineering, aerospace manufacturing, software development and advanced materials. Amazing research and innovation are occurring here.

LaSalletech, a local company founded in Hancock was recently acquired by CameronTec Group (Itiviti AB) of Stockholm, Sweden. Lasalletech specializes in the provision of products and services for messaging and transaction processing to improve the quality of financial services.

Pettibone Traverse Lift is a leading manufacturer of material-handling equipment founded in 1881 and headquartered in Baraga, Michigan. The company's product lineups include the Cary-Lift family of rough-terrain forklifts and the Extendo and Traverse telehandler model families.

Calumet Electronics, manufacturer of printed circuit boards with over 300 employees has hired Moyle Construction, to build a 35,000 sq. ft. expansion which will be completed in 2022.






